In the event of a tie for any place, the points awarded will be divided in the same ways as the prizes.

3. PRIZE GIVING CEREMONY

The owner of the winning horse is invited to the prize giving ceremony for the Grand Prix.

Mounted attendance at prize giving, at the end of each class, will be obligatory for the eight top placed riders in each class (on the basis of one prize for each four participating competitors – Art. 129.3)

Leading riders of the overall CSIO will be awarded their trophies at the conclusion of the class N°11.

4. DEDUCTIONS FROM PRIZE MONEY

The settlement of amounts owed by the organizing committee for foreign riders will be based Foward art.130.2. Gains will be distributed, at the latest, at the end of the last race of the competition. The art .30. II of the Finance Act for 1990, amending Article .182. B in January 1990, exposes persons domiciled outside France for artistic or athletic, supplied or used in France, restraint the specific source of 15% subject to the provisions of the International Conventions. CB and Cash (euro) are only accepted. The O.C could also pay by transfer, the foreign riders have to give their particulars of one's bank account.

5. INSURANCES

All owners and **Athletes** are personally responsible for damages to third parties caused by themselves, their employees, their agents or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third-party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.

All horses travelling **from a non-UE country** entering French territory must be in possession of a temporary importation permit issued by U.N.I.C.. All foreign competitors taking part in the La BAULE competition, in order to cross the border, must be in possession of a certificate issued by the "Transitaire Officiel" with a description of each horse. On entering the French territory, horses will be covered by a temporary admission permit. A deposit exemption will be endorsed on presentation of this permit and of the required temporary import documents. All the consignments and transportation of horses to the CSIO La BAULE will be carried out by: HORSE LOGISTIC COMPANY.

Customs clearance of horses shall be carried out at the place of their arrival. Any customs clearance carried out at the border or in any other place but the competition area or through another agent shall not be paid for by the Organizing Committee.

THE FEI CODE OF CONDUCT

FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The Fédération Equestre Internationale (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI's Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1. At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.
2. Horses and **Athletes** must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.
3. Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.
4. Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.
- 5. The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.**
