Dimensions: 62 x 60 metres – sand.

- The Organizing Committee reserves the right to invoice a number of individual riders from non-invited team nations (FEI regulation) with a maximum of three horses per rider.

1 - COMPETITORS & CHEFS D'EQUIPE

The Organizing Committee will take responsibility for the lodging of Chefs d'Equipe and invited participants from midday on Wednesday, 4th May to midday on Monday, 9th May. Catering is foreseen from Wednesday evening 4th May to Sunday evening 8th May. Everyone will be lodged by the Organizing Committee in a double room which includes continental breakfast. Any extras such as drinks, telephone etc...., remains the responsibility of the invitees.

Canceling of your reservation, before or after the period taken chargeable to the CO, must be transmitted at least 3 days before your arrival. In the other case, it will remain your responsibility.

👉 The rooms will not be booked for the **Sunday night 8th May** unless requested by riders **in writing** before the closing date for define entries.

Travelling expenses for Chefs d'Equipe and invited foreign riders will be based on the cost of a 2nd class return SNCF rail fare from the French border.

2 - GROOMS

The grooms of all riders (French and foreign) who wish to have a hotel room, chargeable to the CO, must apply in writing at the same time as the definite entries. This hotel is at 5 km far from the stable area.

Breakfast will be offered free of charge in the stable area. Lunch and dinner will be as well chargeable to the CO.

3 - HORSES

Transportation expenses for the horses and the invited foreign riders will be paid by the Organizing Committee up to **Euros 450** per invited foreign rider.

The horses who appear on the definite entry list will be lodged free of charge in boxes within the stable area neighbouring the competition arena from midday on Tuesday 3rd May **to midday on Monday 9th May**.

The boxes will be furnished with wood shavings. Additional wood shavings will be available at the price of **Euros 12** (including taxes) per bale and hay at a rate of **Euros 5** (including taxes) per small bale.

Horses will be received between 3:00 and 6:00 p.m. on **Tuesday 3rd May**, other days from 9:00 a.m. to midday and between 3:00 and 6:00 p.m. *or by special arrangement (Tel: +33 (0)2 40 60 02 80 / fax: +33 (0)2 40 60 88 28)*.

It will be possible for the horses to be accommodated in La Baule before and / or after the competition. Each supplementary day will be billed at a rate of **Euros 30** (including taxes) per horse.

For the duration of the competition any non-participating horses will be accommodated outside the official stable area at a rate of **Euros 37** (including taxes) per day per horse, as long as space is reserved in advance and as long as space is available.

4 - LOCAL TRANSPORT

Cars will be organized to shuttle officials, riders, and journalists between the hotel, the arena and the stables.

5 - ADVERTISING ON COMPETITORS AND HORSES (Art.136)

Competitors **are authorized** to carry the logo of their personal sponsor on their saddle cloth in accordance with Art. 136 of the General Regulations.

The Chief Steward is responsible for ensuring that FEI Regulations relating to Art. 136 are respected by riders before entering the arena. Competitors not complying with Art. 136 will not be permitted to enter the arena during the competition.

DECLARATION OF ENTRIES FOR EACH CLASS

Declaration of TEAMS must be made at the Entry Office on wednesday 4th May 2005 before 6:30 pm.

"According to art. 253, during a CSIO, the day before the start of the competition, and according to a time fixed by the CO, Chefs d'Equipe must transmit to the Entry Office the list of riders and horses who will compete in a team or as individual. (Art. 249)"

Entries for each class must be made at the competitors' office as indicated below:

For class nos. 1, 2 & 3: **Wednesday 4th May before 6:30 p.m.**

For the other classes no later than 30 minutes after the end of the previous day's last class, for the next day.

VII - CUSTOMS FORMALITIES

All horses travelling **from a non-UE country** entering French territory must be in possession of a temporary importation permit issued by U.N.I.C. (104, rue Réaumur - 75002 PARIS Tel.: +33 (0)1 45 08 88 60 / Fax: +33 (0)1 45 08 88 03)

All foreign competitors taking part in the La BAULE competition, in order to cross the border, must be in possession of a certificate issued by the "Transitaire Officiel" with a description of each horse. On entering the French territory, horses will be covered by a temporary admission permit. A deposit exemption will be endorsed on presentation of this permit and of the required temporary import documents. All the consignments and transportation of horses to the CSIO La BAULE will be carried out by:

2 - VETERINARY MATTERS 'A'

According to Veterinary Regulations 9th edition, 1 January 2002.

VETERINARY EXAMS, HORSES INSPECTION, PASSPORT CONTROLS

Shall be carried out in accordance with article 1011 of the Veterinary Regulations, 9th edition effective on 1st January 2002 and Appendix VII of the Rules for Jumping Events, 21st edition, effective on 1st January 2003.

The veterinary inspection will take place at the international stables on Wednesday 4th May from 2:00 p.m. to 6:30 p.m..

There will be no inspection on Thursday 5th May 2005.

The General Regulations 21th edition effective on 2005 will apply.

In accordance with Art. 139.1

'Every horse entered for any competition at CANs or CSIs* in a foreign country, and all horses entered for other CSIs**/**/*/*/*/*/*/*, CSIOs, Championships and Regional and Olympic Games, whether at Home or in foreign countries, must have an official, valid FEI Passport, or a National Passport approved by the FEI accompanied by an FEI Recognition Card, as a means of identification and to establish ownership.

Art. 139.2

Horses taking part in CSNs and CSI* in their own country are not required to have such a passport as mentioned in paragraph 1. All such horses must be properly registered and identifiable by diagram. Unless there is no national requirement for equine influenza vaccination in the host country and in the country of origin all horses must have a valid vaccination certificate.

EQUINE INFLUENZA VACCINATION, Vet. Regs. Annexe VI

All horses and ponies for which an F.E.I. passport, or a national passport approved by the F.E.I. has been issued, must have the vaccination section endorsed by a veterinarian, who is not the owner of the animal. This endorsement shall state that the horse has received two injections for primary vaccination against equine influenza, given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. In addition, a booster injection must be recorded as having been given within each succeeding 6 months, subsequent to the second injection of the primary vaccination.

None of these injections must have been given within the preceding 7 days, including the day of the competition or of entry into the competition stables.

The above-mentioned rules are the minimum required. In the case of the first vaccination as well as booster injections, it is recommended to follow the manufacturer's instructions which correspond to the regulations prescribed by the F.E.I. In a number of cases, booster injections are recommended at intervals shorter than 6 months.

SAMPLING FOR PROHIBITED SUBSTANCES **(Vet. Regs. Chap.V & VI and Annexe III)**

Special directives are applicable for competitions subjected to the Medication Control Program of the FEI (Group I and II only). During any other international event, horses and/or ponies can be subjected to sampling for prohibited substances. Such sampling is compulsory in CSIs Category A, CSIOs, Qualifiers and Finals of the World Cup, Championships and Games. It is recommended for other categories of CSIs.

MEDICATION CONTROL PROGRAMME (Groups I and II only)

Competitors in CSIs, CSIOs, Championships and Games must pay the equivalent of CHF12.50 per horse to the Organizing Committee of each competition as a contribution towards the expenses of this Programme.

According to the medication control program (MCP) in force in **Groups I and II**, all samples taken according to Art. 1017.1 of the Veterinary Regulations have been analyzed by the **Laboratoire des courses hippiques (LCH)**.

4 - SANITARY CONDITIONS FOR THE IMPORTATION OF HORSES

Competitors shall be in possession of a valid veterinary certificate according to the country of origin, stating compliance with veterinary regulations covering international exchanges.

IX - MISCELLANEOUS

1 - OBJECTIONS / CLAIMS

To be valid, any objection/claim shall be filed in writing and include a deposit equivalent to **CHF 150**.

2 - OVERALL RANKING AT THE END OF THE CLASSES

The ranking will be established for all the classes taking place each day and for the overall event. Trophies will be awarded to the leading riders and to the owner of the best horse for the overall competition.

3 - PRIZES / CLASSIFICATION (Art. 128-129)

Mounted attendance at prize giving, at the end of each class, will be obligatory for the eight top placed riders in each class (on the basis of one prize for each four participating competitors – Art. 129.3)

At the end of each competition, points will be awarded by the Jury to ranked competitors.

In the event of a tie for any place, the points awarded will be divided in the same ways as the prizes. The ranking will be calculated for all classes on each day and for the overall event. Trophies will be awarded to the best competitors and the owner of the best horse in the CSIO La Baule.

Leading riders of the overall CSIO will be awarded their trophies at the conclusion of the class N°11.

4 - DISTRIBUTION OF PRIZES AND ALLOWANCES (Art. 130)

The payment of prizes owed to foreign competitors by the Organizing Committee will be made in accordance with Art. 130.2. Prize monies will be distributed no later than immediately following the last class. Since 1st January 1990, in according with article 30.II of the 1990 Finance Law amending article 182.B of the CGI (French General Tax Code) payments made as remuneration for artistic or sporting services provided or used in France, to persons residing outside France, have been subject to a 15% deduction at source, under the conditions laid down by International Conventions.

An official form stating the amount of tax deducted will be provided to the competitors by the Organizing Committee.

The CO has the right to wait the moment a rider has paid his entry fee and other bills to give him his prize.

5 - DOCTOR – VETERINARIAN – FARRIER

All medical, veterinary as well as farriery care will be the responsibility of the owners, riders or other interested parties.

The Organizing Committee will not contribute to these payments.

6 - INSURANCE

'Every rider or horse owner is solely responsible for third party risks for himself, his employees, his assistants, as well as third party risk for his own horse. It is therefore strongly recommended that every rider or owner contact a 'Civil Responsibility' insurer to arrange sufficient cover for competitions whether they are abroad or in his own country, and to rigorously maintain such policies.'

7 - COMPETITION ORGANIZER (Art. 115)

In the event of unforeseen circumstances, the Organizing Committee, with the approval of the Chef d'Equipe and the Ground Jury, reserve the right to modify the programme in any way in order to resolve the situation and may, in certain circumstances, have the right to cancel or postpone classes. Such modifications must be communicated to all the competitors and officials as quickly as possible, and notified to the General Secretariat by the foreign judge.

In case of canceling, riders can not submit any complains against the CO or receive any financial compensations. However, the amount of their entry fee will be repaid.

The CO is free to use pictures or movies made during the event in the event area.

8 - AUTHORIZED ENTRY INTO THE COMPETITION STABLE AREA

In order to be allowed necessary access to the FEI stable area, the names of owners (maximum of two per horse) - must be declared at the same time as the definitive entry of their horse. It is essential that riders and their grooms indicate their full names and role to the Jumping Secretariat before **29 April 2005**.

9 - WARM-UP DURING CLASSES

The competitors who may wish to warm-up their horses during the speed competitions shall inform the Organizing Committee before the start of these classes. They will be the first ones to start.

The final approval of the schedule by the FEI according to Art. 115.1 only refers to the compliance of its contents with the FEI Statutes and Regulations. Under no circumstances should it include the implicit acceptance of any liability for damage caused by the Organizing Committee and its officials, competitors, owners and their horses.

NORMAL STABLE SECURITY / STABLE SURVEILLANCE FOR INTERNATIONAL COMPETITIONS

ENFORCEMENT DIRECTIVES OF RV ART. 1005.2.5.

1 - ACCESS TO THE ENCLOSED STABLE AREA

The stables must be completely enclosed by a barrier placed within an appropriate restrictive perimeter (stable area) which will serve both as a deterrent to the admission of unauthorized personnel and to the exit of horses. The structure must be sufficiently large to allow the evacuation of horses from the stable area in case of an emergency, but still remain within the confines of the perimeter.

Whenever possible the stable area must include only stables. The lorries, caravans, etc., must not have access to this zone unless they are serving specifically as lodging for horses or grooms.

Access to stables will be limited to those persons indicated in Art. 1005.2.5.2 of the RV. It is essential that the official responsible for authorizing access must be a trustworthy person of seniority from within the Organizing Committee.

2 - ENTRY CONTROL

A control system must operate at all entrance gates in order to allow, by a reliable and efficient method, identification of all those who enter and leave the stables at any time.

Additional vigilance must be applied when identifying persons and reasons for entering the stables during the nighttime hours.

3 - SURVEILLANCE OF THE STABLE AREA

At least one stable steward directly responsible to the Chief Steward, must be present or readily available in the vicinity of the stable area 24 hours a day during the entire competition. He may be helped by assistants if necessary. The steward or his assistants must regularly patrol the whole stable area, without a pre-determined pattern in order to discourage any unlawful practices or abuse towards the horses. The steward responsible for stable surveillance must immediately be informed of any infraction which must, in turn, be reported to the Chief Steward.

The duty of the stewards is to safeguard the welfare of the horses and to prevent any form of unlawful practices.

4 - GROOMS

It is appreciated that grooms may wish to remain with their horses during the night. Only grooms duly registered with the Organizing Committee have the authority to do so.

The person in charge must ensure that these grooms, or any other authorized persons with access to their horses, are familiar with security and the rigorous surveillance procedures operating throughout the competition.

5 - MOVEMENT THROUGHOUT THE COMPETITION AREA

Movement of horses between the stables, practice ring, rest area and main competition arena must be strictly controlled. An example of the optimum layout for the infrastructures of show jumping and dressage is attached. It is appreciated that flexibility will be required depending on the requirements of other disciplines,

6 - SURVEILLANCE OF THE PRACTICE RING

The Chief Steward must ensure that all the practice rings are adequately monitored during official opening times. He must also ensure that all practice rings are practice arena is adequately stewarded at all times when they are officially open. He must also ensure that random surveillance of practice rings is carried out when they are officially closed.

7 - REST AREA

For all outdoor competitions, a grazing area must be provided and be subject to casual surveillance. If this area is available, it must be used exclusively for grazing horses or walking them in hand.

The Foreign Judge/TD at competitions must especially monitor the application of prescribed directives, but in the most reasonable manner possible for each discipline. He must be aware of any shortcomings and, if necessary, changing the category of a competition could be considered.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR THE WELFARE OF THE HORSE

The “Fédération Equestre Internationale” (FEI) expects all those involved in international equestrian sport to adhere to the FEI’s Code of Conduct and to acknowledge and accept that at all times the welfare of the horse must be paramount and must never be subordinated to competitive or commercial influences.

1 - At all stages during the preparation and training of competition horses, welfare must take precedence over all other demands. This includes good horse management, training methods, farriery and tack, and transportation.

2 - Horses and competitors must be fit, competent and in good health before they are allowed to compete. This encompasses medication use, surgical procedures that threaten welfare or safety, pregnancy in mares and the misuse of aids.

3 - Events must not prejudice horse welfare. This involves paying careful attention to the competition areas, ground surfaces, weather conditions, stabling, site safety and fitness of the horse for onward travel after the event.

4 - Every effort must be made to ensure that horses receive proper attention after they have competed and that they are treated humanely when their competition careers are over. This covers proper veterinary care, competition injuries, euthanasia and retirement.

5 - The FEI urges all involved with the sport to attain the highest levels of education in their areas of expertise.
