# Words of champions

**F**our days of competition, four days of top-level sport, four days of excellence. The Jumping International de La Baule – Officiel de France offers world-class events every day. Some of the great names in the history of the competition, as well as today's stars, reflect on its key highlights.

## Friday June 12

### Barrière Nations Cup - 1 : 30 PM

[Prize : € 250.000]

**Nick Skelton (GBR, individual Olympic champion 2016 and team champion 2012, winner of the La Baule Grand Prix in 2012 with Carlo 273):**

"Competing in La Baule has always been a great pleasure. I came here for many years. **The event is one of the finest traditional competitions on the circuit.** The Nations Cup is always a special moment, of course. Representing your country, wearing your national team jacket, is an honor. It is actually one of my best memories in La Baule with Big Star. **In May 2016, he was coming back from injury and delivered a perfect double clear round. It set us on the right path to Rio, where we went on to win the Olympic title."**

**Gilles Thomas (BEL, 2025 European team champion, member of the world Top 10):**

"I came here for the first time last year, but I had been following the event for a long time. **A lot of people had told me about it. It is obviously one of the finest shows of the summer, with the Nations Cup and the Rolex Grand Prix.** The World Championships in Aachen are the main goal of the season, and with that in mind, the La Baule Nations Cup will be very important, especially with the same grass conditions. It will be one of the last shows before giving my horses a bit of rest, so it will be excellent preparation. **It is always an honor to ride for the Belgian team. The Nations Cup is actually my favorite class.** Belgium is a strong team, and being part of it means that victory is possible. We came close last year (2nd)."



**Saturday, June 13**

**La Baule Derby – Demeures de Campagne – 5 : 15 PM**

(Prize : € 56.800)

**Patrice Delaveau** (FRA, individual World silver medalist 2014 and team silver medalist in 2010 and 2014, winner of the La Baule Derby in 1993 with Orient de Frebourg, in 2013 and 2016 with Ornella Mail HDC, and in 2019 with Vestale de Mazure HDC; Grand Prix winner in 1990, 2013 and 2018):

**“The Jumping of La Baule is the Roland Garros of French riders. When you’re young, taking part in it is a dream.** The CSIO is often a stepping stone toward selection for a major championship, which makes it even more important. The Derby is a very special class. It used to be just as important as the Grand Prix. It has had to adapt with the evolution of the sport, but at one time there were up to 30 starters and riders even went outside the arena. The public loves it. It’s a class that is ridden differently, a bit like a cross-country course in eventing. You also have to prepare your horse for a longer effort.”

**Richard Vogel** (GER, individual European champion and team bronze medalist in 2025, winner of the Rolex Grand Prix of the Dutch Masters 2026 and the Rolex Grand Prix of Aachen 2023, member of the world Top 5):

**“I rode the La Baule Derby – Demeures de Campagne for the first time last year. It was truly a great experience.** I really enjoy this type of class. Courses often look similar, but in a derby there are many different obstacles, a lot of variety. There are not

many left nowadays, so it’s fantastic that La Baule can maintain such a traditional event. You need a very brave horse, one that isn’t afraid of water and doesn’t hesitate in front of these different obstacles. The distances can sometimes be tricky, for example when going downhill off a bank. But when you have the right horse, it’s really a lot of fun. More generally, the Jumping of La Baule is a fantastic show with ideal conditions for the horses. The grass arena in the stadium is perfect and we have a beautiful warm-up area. **The horses really feel good when they are in La Baule. There is also all the charm of the town and the pleasure, in the morning, of being able to ride our horses on the beach.”**





## Prix Saur – 11 : 30 AM

(Prize : € 110.000)

**Jessica Kuerten** (IRL, European team champion 2001, World Cup Final runner-up 2006):

“It is always wonderful to return to La Baule. It will be even more special for me this year as Chef d'Équipe of the Irish team especially with the World Championships in Aachen on the horizon, which should raise the level of competition even further. All classes are important, including this one, as its prize money offers valuable points for the world rankings. In consultation with the riders, we make strategic decisions. **As for my best memory in La Baule I hope to create it this summer.**”

**Jeanne Sadran** (FRA, member of the French team at the latest European Championships):

“The Jumping of La Baule has a special flavor. It's our CSIO of France, and the French crowd is always incredible I look forward to going every year. **The program is very appealing, with the 'major' classes as well as all the others, including the qualifiers.**

So I try to bring two good horses. Things change a bit if you compete in the Nations Cup, but it's our major event of the year. I try to field my best horses in the Nations Cup and the Grand Prix, but we always aim to place in as many classes as possible. **La Baule was my first CSIO5\* I was only 18. I took part together with Nina (Mallevaey). We were stable teammates, and it was simply incredible. Four years later, we competed together in the Nations Cup! We have wonderful memories of it.**”



**Sunday, June 14**

**Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule – 2 : 30 PM**

(Prize : € 500.000)

**Michel Robert** (FRA, World team champion 1982, individual and team World silver medalist 1994, Olympic team bronze medalist 1988 and 1992, winner of the La Baule Grand Prix in 1981 with Gazelle d'Elle, 1983 with Grand Cœur A, 1989 with Vendamour II and 1996 with Vondéen, Derby winner in 1991 and 2007) :

**“La Baule is one of the greatest competitions on the calendar, with its grass arena, its location, its crowd, and its history. I was first placed here in 1972! Winning the Grand Prix four times is a great source of pride. It's a major challenge, especially with the Nations Cup on Friday, which is the other big class. You need your best horse to perform right from the start of the show and then keep that form through to Sunday. You never get used to winning such a Grand Prix, because each time it's a new story you write with a new horse. For example, my last victory with Vondéen was almost impossible to imagine.”**



**Nina Mallevaey** (FRA, world No.1 rider, member of the French team at the latest European Championships):  
**“The Jumping of La Baule is truly an iconic competition. For a French rider, it is inevitably a special event. There is a very unique atmosphere, with a knowledgeable and passionate crowd. You can feel a real enthusiasm, and it always makes you want to perform at your best. The public is very close to the riders and horses, and there is always incredible energy. I was lucky to compete in the Nations Cup last year, and being French in La Baule during that class is something unforgettable. The Grand Prix is a class that makes every rider dream. When you look at the list of great champions who have won it, you understand how prestigious it is. It's a dream to have your name on that list. You approach the Grand Prix with the desire to push beyond your limits. When you enter the arena, you truly feel the support of the crowd. These are very powerful moments.”**



**Barrière Nations Cup – Friday, June 12**

**1:30 p.m.**

**(Prize money: €250,000)**

Ten teams at the start. In line with horse welfare, each nation is represented by four horse-and-rider combinations (with the three best scores counting).

Last French victory: 2017.

**2025 winner :**

**Ireland** (Bertram Allen with Qonquest de Rigo; Seamus Hughes Kennedy with ESI Rocky; Tom Wachman with Tabasco de Toxandria Z; Cian O'Connor with Bentley de Sury; Chef d'Équipe: Michael Blake).

**Prix Saur – Saturday, June 13**

**11:00 a.m. (Prize money: €110,000)**

The second most important individual class in terms of prize money. A major source of points for the world rankings, the Prix Saur also offers the opportunity to qualify for the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule.

**2025 winner :**

**Shane Sweetnam (IRL), with Gilona AO**

**Derby de la Baule – Demeures de Campagne – Saturday, June 13**

**5:00 p.m. (Dotation : 56 800 €)**

A traditional course featuring natural obstacles (water crossings, banks, drops, mounds) and lasting over 2 minutes 10 seconds.

Last French victory: Patrice Delaveau, with Vestale de Mazure HDC, in 2019

**2025 winner :**

**Steve Guerdat (SUI), with Easy Star de Talma**

**Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule - Sunday, June 14**

**2:30 p.m. (Prize money: €500,000)**

The Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule, part of the Rolex Series, is the grand finale of the event, featuring 50 riders at the start. A first round determines the clear rounds, which then qualify for the jump-off.

Last French victory: Nicolas Delmotte, with Urvoso du Roch, in 2021.

**2025 winner :**

**Daniel Deusser (GER), with Otello de Guldenboom.**

**CSI 1\***

**Lola Courbet, CSI 1\* rider for the past ten years:**

“For amateur riders, it’s incredibly impressive. Every time, we feel like we’re taking part in our own Olympic Games. In the warm-up arena and in the stables, we come across the greatest champions. **It’s like being in Disneyland with our eyes wide open.** It’s also special for our horses, because with the large crowds, the grass arena, and the whole setting, the environment is unusual. **You never get used to moments like these.**”

From Thursday, June 14, CSI 1\* participants will compete on the same arena as the world’s top riders. On Saturday, June 16 (2:45 p.m.), the CSI 1\* Derby, sponsored by Laiterie de Montaigu, will offer the same thrills as the champions’ event.

The highlight of the CSI 1\* is scheduled for Sunday at 12:30 p.m. with the CSI 1\* Range Rover Grand Prix (prize money: €11,000).

The total prize money for the CSI 1\* amounts to €39,000.

## Kevin Staut – Olympic team champion

“La Baule is one of the most beautiful competitions of the year, with that strong CSIO identity and two major highlights: the Nations Cup and the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule.

The event has managed to preserve its identity, with the Derby on Saturday and a major qualifying class for the Grand Prix as early as Thursday. It is essential to maintain historic competitions like this one so that we can practice our sport on a different level. I remember my first La Baule in 2007. I was both a competitor and a spectator, because even though I had seen the event on TV, I had never been there in person.

The team selector, Gilles de Balanda, gave me an individual spot at La Baule. I was initially a reserve rider, and after Thursday’s class, I made it onto the team. First La Baule and straight into the Nations Cup. It was incredible.”



## Matthieu Volz – Director

“My best memory at the Jumping International de La Baule remains my first time directing the event in 2021, which marked its return after a year’s interruption due to Covid.

With the enthusiasm of a crowd delighted to be back at the Stade François-André, Nicolas Delmotte’s victory in the Grand Prix Ville de La Baule was a standout moment.

I also vividly remember Daniel Deusser’s victory last year in the Rolex Grand Prix Ville de La Baule. His fluid style and great humility made it a beautiful sporting moment that we were fortunate to capture on film.”

# On the road to Aachen... and Los Angeles

The Jumping International de La Baule and in particular its Barrière Nations Cup represents a key milestone just two months ahead of the World Championships in Aachen (Germany), which serve as qualifiers for the 2028 Olympic Games in Los Angeles.

For a long time, many riders and team selectors have made the Jumping International de La Baule one of their top priorities, especially so this year.

Around two months before the World Championships in Aachen (August 19–23 for show jumping), the first qualifying stage for the future Olympic Games in Los Angeles (with the seven best nations, excluding the United States, securing their spot), the La Baule event will offer a valuable opportunity to establish key benchmarks.



Appointed head coach of the French team in 2025, Édouard Coupérie emphasizes the importance of this 2026 edition: “The Jumping International de La Baule – Officiel de France is always a very important event in our season,” confirms this regular competitor, who won the Grand Prix there in 2001 with Pro Pilot III and the Nations Cup in 1993 with Quat’Sous, alongside Éric Navet (Quito de Baussy), Hubert Bourdy (Razzia du Poncel), and Michel Robert (Nonix). “It will be even more important this year with the World Championships ahead, also held on a grass arena.

Some horses are more or less comfortable on this surface, so many teams will aim to compete on grass this summer to gather information. It will also allow us to test certain things, such as studs, for example. Our advantage is being able to enter many horse-and-rider combinations individually, which allows us to carry out a thorough review of our squad. Of course, there are still two months to go before the World Championships, and with horses, a lot can

happen. But I should have a good idea of my French team after La Baule.”

Despite this outlook, the Jumping International de La Baule will mainly its identity. “As a course designer, I don’t necessarily have those Championships in mind,” explains Grégory Bodo. “Of course, I could draw some parallels, particularly with the same grass footing, but it wouldn’t be appropriate for me to design with the challenges of Aachen in mind even if some selectors will use the event to test combinations before establishing their short list. A championship is a competition at a specific moment. La Baule is a different event with its own DNA. I have to respect that. So I will approach it as I do every year, thinking first and foremost about the athletes, horses and riders who are competing in La Baule.”

Still, there is no doubt that, in the arena, some will already have one eye on the Soers Stadium in Aachen.



## Andy Booth Masterclass, Ambassador for Horse Wel-



**A**s a matter of course, animal welfare has always been part of the DNA of the Jumping International de La Baule. Significant investments have been made in recent years to provide horses with the best possible conditions, both in their stabling and in the arena where they perform. Not to mention the unique privilege of being able to take them for a walk on La Baule's beach each morning.

For this 2026 edition, Andy Booth, an internationally recognized expert in equine ethology will host a Masterclass on Saturday, June 13 at 7:15 p.m. A chance to meet the man many call "the horse whisperer."

### - Andy, what is your definition of animal "well-being"?

That the horse feels well mentally, emotionally, and physically in all circumstances that is, in daily life as well as in training and that its fundamental needs are respected: social interaction, access to forage, and movement.

But well-being is not only about living conditions. It also concerns the way we communicate with the horse. A horse that does not understand what is being asked of it can quickly find itself in a situation of stress or conflict. Respecting its well-being also means respecting how it learns and understands.

### - What will your Masterclass at the Jumping of La Baule focus on? How will it work?

I will base this Masterclass on equine learning. I'll explain the difference between educating and controlling, and guide riders toward the goal of performing exercises with minimal constraint and restraint using the body more effectively, relying less on the hands, and encouraging horses to respond to subtle aids rather than physical force.

We will also demonstrate how to motivate a horse to jump obstacles, by showing how to make the rider's idea become the horse's idea.

In training, it's important for riders to respect both the horse's cognitive abilities and its limitations. Horses don't have a concept of "right" or "wrong" something either benefits them or it doesn't.

It is essential to respect the horse's learning process by understanding how horses learn and perceive riding. Horses learn through the release of pressure: pressure encourages the horse to find a solution, but it is the release that truly teaches.

### - What is the main message you would like to convey?

The priority is to understand how to educate the horse. There is a significant difference between motivation/education and restraint/handling.

Riders should not be just "pilots," but true animal educators, in order to build greater collaboration with the horse and reduce the need for constraint and conflict.

Better understanding how horses learn leads to more ethical riding and improved performance.

# How it works ?

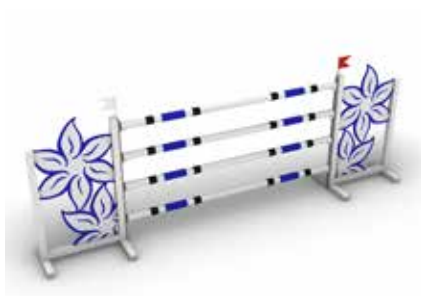
Show jumping competitions are governed by a set of rules designed to assess the precision, speed, and agility of horse and rider as they navigate a course of obstacles.

## Basic rules

Objective: The main goal is to complete a course of jumps, usually ranging from 10 to 16 obstacles, in the correct order with the fewest faults within a specified time.

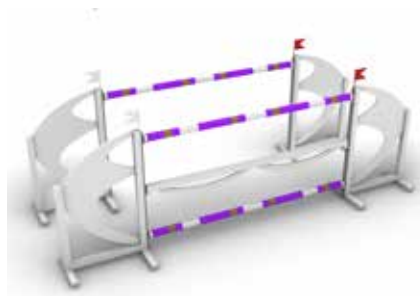
Faults: Faults are penalties that are accrued when certain mistakes are made. : Knocking down a rail, refusal to jump, Exceeding time allowed, fall of horse or rider...

Each course is unique, with obstacles set in varied sequences and distances. The course typically includes a mix of verticals, oxers, combinations, and other jump types, testing different aspects of horse and rider ability.



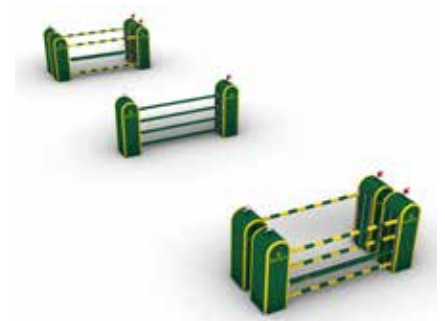
Vertical :

A single line of poles placed one above the other to create a straight-up-and-down obstacle. They have no spread, making them appear tall relative to their height.



Oxer :

A spread fence that consists of two poles set apart to form a wide jump.



Combinaison :

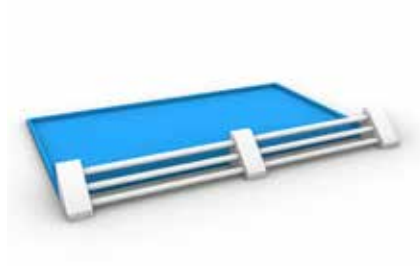
Consists of two or more fences placed in close succession to test the horse and rider's ability to maintain rhythm and accuracy. They can be labelled as:

Double combination: Two jumps placed one or two strides apart.  
Triple combination: Three jumps, each set one or two strides apart.



Triple bar :

A spread fence with three elements of increasing height, creating an ascending jump where the back pole is the highest.



Water jump :

A wide jump that involves a large open water tray. The primary challenge here is the width, and it often requires careful approach and takeoff.



Wall :

Designed to look solid and resemble brick walls or other solid structures. They are usually built of lightweight materials that easily fall if knocked.

# CSIO 5\* - Les engagés

## La Baule accueille les plus grands

Une semaine des premières épreuves du Jumping International de La Baule – Officiel de France (6-9 juin), le plateau du CSI 5\* est désormais connu. Fidèles au concours depuis toujours, les meilleurs mondiaux se sont une nouvelle fois donné rendez-vous au stade François André. Parmi les cavaliers présents, beaucoup représenteront l'une des neuf équipes engagées dans la prestigieuse Coupe des Nations Barrière et tous rêveront de briller tout au long des quatre jours de compétition, avec, en bouquet final, le Rolex Grand Prix de la Ville de La Baule.

La piste est prête, les tribunes sont prêtes à accueillir le public et les stands des différents villages sont posées dans les allées du Stade François André. Dans une semaine, les cavaliers et leurs chevaux prendront possession des lieux. Avec forcément l'ambition de briller dans un événement qu'ils apprécient particulièrement. Avec des champions olympiques, du monde, d'Europe, d'Amérique du Sud et du Nord, le plateau de cette édition 2024 a fait le plein d'étoiles.

De jeudi à dimanche, plusieurs temps forts rythmeront leur journée. Vendredi, la Coupe des Nations Barrière permettra de voir s'affronter 36 couples représentant 9 nations (les huit meilleures en seconde manche). Une superbe occasion pour tous les chefs d'équipe de se projeter vers le rendez-vous olympique de cet été, à Versailles.

Pour la dernière fois au tableau d'honneur en 2017, la France voudra forcément briller devant son public. Pour représenter les Vestes Bleues, le sélectionneur Henk Nooren et l'équipe fédérale ont retenu, Roger-Yves Bost (Delph de Denat HDC), Simon Delestre (I Amelusina R 51), Olivier Robert (Iglesias DV), Jeanne Sadran (Dexter de Kerglenn) et Kevin Staut (Visconti du Telman). « La Baule est un des concours les plus extraordinaires de l'année car il y a cette empreinte de la Coupe des Nations, explique Kevin Staut. Le concours a réussi à garder son identité. Dans le public, il y a les fidèles présents pendant quatre jours mais aussi ceux qui choisissent leur journée en fonction de leur intérêt. C'est formidable. Des concours historiques comme celui-là nous permettent de pratiquer notre sport dans une autre dimension. »

Le chef d'équipe des Tricolores observera également très attentivement dans les autres épreuves les 13 cavaliers engagés à titre individuel : Nicolas Delmotte, Marie Demonte, Marc Dilasser, Olivier



Perreau, Nicolas Layec, Julien Gonin, François-Xavier Boudant, Edward Levy, Pierre-Marie Friant, Mégane Moissonnier, le champion olympique par équipes 2016 Philippe Rozier, le champion de France Cédric Hurel et Philippe Léoni.

Victorieux l'an dernier et en 2018, le Brésil comptera sur Luiz Felipe de Azevedo Filho, Luciana Diniz, Luciana Lossio et Yuri Mansur et Santiago Lambre pour défendre son titre.

Championne du monde et championne olympique en titre, la Suède sait se mobiliser dans les grandes occasions. Elle espère inscrire son nom au palmarès pour la première fois de son histoire avec Angelica Augustsson Zanotelli, Peder Fredricson, Amanda Landeblad, Petronella Andersson et Linda Heed.

Avec Steve Guerdat (n°3 mondial), Martin Fuchs (n°5), Pius Schwizer, Edouard Schmitz et Alain Jufer, la Suisse, victorieuse en 2019 et 2021, présente une équipe très compétitive. « C'est un des meilleurs concours de l'année sans hésitation, confie Guerdat, champion olympique en 2012. Le terrain est extraordinaire, le stade est fantastique avec une ambiance géniale. Le concours rassemble les trois



épreuves que je préfère avec le Grand Prix, la Coupe des Nations et le Derby. C'est aussi un concours qui a su se moderniser et garder sa tradition. C'est tout ce que j'aime. »

Nation forte de la discipline depuis de nombreuses décennies, l'Allemagne n'a pourtant plus gagné en Loire-Atlantique depuis 2007. Pour mettre fin à l'attente, la Mannschaft comptera sur Marcus Ehning, Kendra Clarica Brinkop récente lauréate du Grand Prix 4\* de Bourg-en-Bresse, Jörne Sprehe, Philipp Weishaupt et David Will.

Vainqueur pour la dernière fois à La Baule en 2005, les États-Unis débarquent en Loire-Atlantique avec une grosse équipe menée par Kent Farrington (n°6) et McLain Ward (n°9), accompagnés de Karl Cook,

récent vainqueur du Rolex Grand Prix de Rome, Lillie Keenan et Aaron Vale. Lors de leur dernière venue, en 2016 ils avaient pris la deuxième place.

Quatre fois victorieuse à La Baule (1999, 2008, 2012 et 2022), la Belgique comptera sur Olivier et Nicola Philippaerts (n°15), Jérôme Guéry, Wilm Vermeir et Grégory Wathelet.

De retour sur les bords de l'Atlantique pour la première fois depuis 2018, l'Espagne compte elle aussi une victoire, en 2002. Elle sera présente à La Baule avec notamment ses deux cavaliers membres du top 100 mondial, Eduardo Alvarez Aznar et Mariano Martinez Bastida.

Portée par Max Kühner, membre du top 10 mondial depuis plusieurs mois, l'Autriche, médaillée de bronze aux derniers championnats d'Europe, sera également au rendez-vous.

Plusieurs cavaliers internationaux seront également présents à titre individuel comme l'Irlandais Shane Sweetnam (n°12), la Britannique Lily Attwood, la cavalière du Liechtenstein Jennifer Hochstadter, les Italiens Lorenzo de Luca et Gampiero Garofalo, la Norvégienne Victoria Gulliksen, le Mexicain Federico Fernandez, le Néerlandais Lars Kersten ou encore les deux Colombiens Roberto Teran et René Lopez.
